THE PEOPLE

Founded in 1993, EarthCorps **cultivates leaders and community partnerships to advance environmental justice**. Our approach combines community engagement and education, leadership development, and technical environmental restoration. Our focus is on building partnerships with Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) communities who are disproportionately impacted by climate change and environmental concerns.

EarthCorps offers a truly unique leadership development and green-jobs training program for young adults ages 18-29. We provide them with the best training program possible to advance their careers in the environmental sector and build an equitable, justice-oriented movement. Combining our Corps Program with our Community and Volunteer Engagement program, we use a co-design method to support the goals and capacity of BIPOC-led and serving organizations to implement **community-led environmental restoration** to advance environmental justice and climate resiliency in communities that bear the brunt of climate change and environmental injustices.

THE PROGRESS

EarthCorps has worked to increase the benefits of and access to climate-resilient, healthy green spaces through environmental restoration, leadership development of our Corps members, and robust community partnerships. This movement we are building addresses climate change and results in tremendous benefits to communities in the Puget Sound region.

Since 1993, we have trained more than **1,300 corps members** who have led and engaged with **200,000 community volunteers** (including 100,000 K-12 students) to restore **11,000 acres** of priority natural areas and plant more than **1.75 million trees**.
